These are also values that we as a staff, should aim to model and share with the children through our actions and responses to them and to each other. These values and opportunities to reinforce them should be evident in everyday school life and in planning learning opportunities for pupils.

At St Alban's we use Life to the Full to deliver our programme of Relationship and Health Education.

It's a programme in Relationships and Health Education based on the Department of Education guidance which became statutory during the academic year 2020/21.
