Dear Parents,

Welcome back everybody and best wishes for good health and happiness in 2020. Hopefully, it will be a great year for St. Alban's and all our families. At the end of term, we had a wonderful last day in school saying goodbye to Mrs Frost who has sent a note of thanks which is printed overleaf.



This term it is heads down and lots of hard work for everyone to ensure that all the children make good progress. It is essential that good attendance is maintained to help this. We do not wish sick children to be in school but equally, good attendance is so important for progress that children must not be off unless they are <u>really</u> unwell. We will soon be sending out individual attendance data for every child so that you can see if your child is meeting the target of 95%. If they are not, good attendance this term will help them towards achieving it.

We expect the children to work with effort and concentration in school and we always have high expectations of behaviour. This is the message we will be giving to the children and we know that you will be encouraging them and supporting us with this. Parents' evenings will be held later in the term but if you have concerns about anything, please arrange to see myself or the class teacher. It is often easier to resolve small concerns before they have the chance to develop and become bigger issues. I will be available every morning, as the children arrive, until 9.15, or you can make an appointment to see me any afternoon apart from Tuesday as I will be teaching.

FIRST FORGIVENESS AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Letters will be going out this week to children in **Year 3** about the programme for preparation to receive these sacraments for the first time. If your child is in **Y4**, **Y5 or Y6** and has **not** made their First Communion, they are also invited to join the programme – please see the school office for a letter. **Children MUST already be baptised** and evidence of this is required. Parents should return the Enrolment form with the letter to the school office as soon as possible and no later than January 31st. Our programme starts on February 9th with the Enrolment Mass and all information needs to be checked by the Parish office before that.

The deadline for applications is January 15th. Those who apply late may not get their first choice of school. If you know anyone with a child who will be 4 before August 31st 2020, please check that they have applied for a school place.

UNIFORM

Your support in ensuring good standards of uniform – green jumpers / cardigans; school ties, sensible black school shoes and so on – is greatly appreciated.

Our policy regarding earrings is that they should not be worn to school and this is in line with the Local Authority Health and Safety Policy. However, plastic posts are safe for the playground and P.E. so it is no problem for the children to wear those.



PARKING AND SAFETY OUTSIDE SCHOOL

There are regular reminders about the safety issues relating to parking outside school. However, there continue to be incidents that cause concern and there were a few just before Christmas.

Our school is situated in a difficult location and there is little we can do about that. We can however, ensure safety is our number 1 consideration. If possible, park away from Ashburton Road and walk the last bit, and under no circumstances park on double yellow lines, zig-zag areas or mount the pavement. I would also request that parents please be respectful of the residents of Ashburton Road and help us to maintain good relationships with our neighbours. Please consider these points carefully and ensure that our children are kept safe at all times. Thank you for your help and understanding in this matter.
