<u>MYON</u>

Congratulations to Jacob Powell in year 2 who read a staggering 56 170 words last week on MYON. Well done to the children in each year group that read the most number of words last week - Keep up the great reading habits!!! We will be watching!!

Accelerated Reader from Year 2 to 6 – helping reading

Thank you for taking on an additional task this week. All children will have their logins now.

- Using this regularly means that a pupil will be reading a suitably challenging book, a book that is at their level and helping them make good progress.
- The children (Under the teacher's direction) can take an online quiz on a book that they are reading.
- After the quiz the children receive instant **feedback** on their results, earning points towards their personalised target. If the child scores over 80% they then move onto the next book-

this ensures that even when not in school we can adjust the book so that it is supporting good reading progress.

• Regular use of Accelerated reader means we can support the reading- even when at remote learning is taking place.
