Summer Uniform

Please remember that summer dresses should be **green** checked or striped and short trousers should be **grey short school trousers** (not casual or sports trousers). Children may wear short sleeved white shirts with their tie or a white polo shirt if they wish. The usual green cardigans and jumpers should continue to be worn. Please also continue to ensure that the children are wearing sensible black school shoes to school. We have a lot of trainers of all varieties being worn at the moment so please ensure it is school shoes for school.

The standards of uniform are important in school as they are a reflection of the high standards we expect in all areas and also reflect our unity as a school. Please encourage your children to respect this, follow the rules and wear their uniform with pride.



PE KIT

Jewellery in School

Please note that no jewellery should be worn to school. This is clearly stated in the school prospectus and has been for many years.

Children with earrings should remove them before coming to school. If you are considering getting your child's ears pierced, please consider waiting until they are leaving us! Alternatively, it should be done right at the start of the summer so that the earrings can be removed when the children return to school. Thank you.

ON-LINE SAFETY

I have attached some information about an App that seems to be very popular at the moment.

As with many of these Apps, they are not dangerous in themselves – however, without very careful monitoring, children can leave themselves vulnerable. The lower age limit for this App is 13 years. If you choose to allow your child to download it, I would urge you to monitor use and ensure privacy settings are set at the highest level of protection. Many of our children are using Apps they enjoy but may not have the maturity to manage safely!
