

Waiting Before School

School starts at 9.00am but doors are open at 8.45am to ease congestion and allow a gradual arrival which hopefully makes it easier for everyone. There should be no need for anyone to be outside much earlier than 8.45am and I would ask that parents of children who walk to school on their own ensure that they do not leave too early. They must arrive after 8.45am so that they can come straight into school and are not waiting, unsupervised outside. There should be **no ball games or running around** outside the doors prior to 8.45am as this could easily lead to an accident or injury and disturbs our neighbours.

It would also be helpful if parents could say goodbye outside or in the porch area so that we can see all the children coming in more easily. Our little ones are now starting to come in through the main doors so please take care as they are coming in. Please understand that all this is to ensure that our children are safe coming in to school.
